1. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

The minutes of the meeting held on 9th May 2022 were approved as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

2. MEMBERS' DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

No declarations were received.

3. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING.

3.1. Highways

Updates, completed work or new issues which have arisen since the last meeting will be noted below. Work which hasn't been completed is listed under 'Pending'.

New/Updated/Completed

- Unofficial layby on Shrigley Road opposite the entrance to Normans Hall. From the tyre tracks it would seem that HGVs have resumed parking. Mr. Macmillan does not seem to have made any further alterations to the 'soil shelf'.

Action: Clerk to contact Andy Simpson and ask about removing soil and bollards.

- CEC Highways Work Programme for 2022-23. Only local reference is in the category Drainage "Shrigley Road-investigation and scheme." Highway Dept. has been asked to clarify. Asked twice but still no response.

Action: Clerk to contact Andy again.

- 3438439 'Chevron Bend' two large holes in the wall. The repair has been finished.

- POY1629 Double yellow lines on the Pott Hall and Spuley Lane bends. Proposal received from Steve Ashton, CEC traffic engineer and confirmation that this scheme will be considered for inclusion in the 2023-24 programme of works, non-comital statement that promises little. Cllr. Saunders willing to invest some of her £4,000 from top-up scheme. Estimated cost was £3,300

Action: Cllr. Wylie will discuss this with Cllr. Saunders.

- At Cllr. Basford's request, the Clerk checked and then reported some of the numbers of the gullies which had been missed in the recent emptying.

Action: Clerk to report them again, this time on online.

Pending

- Remedial resurfacing of Shrigley Road from Green Close to the aqueduct.

- Project 1421 (PACP list) Modifications to the 'Chevron Bend'

- Fingerpost at junction of Street Lane and London Road.

3.2. CRICKET CLUB

Robert Street has again asked Kevin to drop off the documents without result.

Action: Clerk to ask Robert Street if the Cricket Club will consider going ahead with the Pre-emption Agreement whether it decides to incorporate or not.

3.3. NECCP meeting 24th May attended by Cllr. Boulton.

Of interest was Poynton TC's purchase of rubber blocks instead of sandbags in case of flooding. Cllr. Boulton also reported an increase in grants being distributed by the NCCCP and the major renovations taking place at Poynton Civic Hall.

Action: The Clerk will put a link to the grant application page on the Council's website.

3.4. QUEEN'S JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS

3.4.1. Cllr. Wray will distribute 13 commemorative mugs to children in church with 8 for the older children and has arranged for 35 to be distributed in school.

3.4.2. The Parish Council bonfire on the Nab was lit at 21.45 on 2nd June and the Village Hall bar was open.

3.5. TELEPHONE KIOSK

Alison Barrott, from charity 'Self Care Matters' kindly withdrew her application to buy the kiosk and the Clerk was successful in cancelling the removal of the equipment. The Council has decided to buy the phone box to prevent this situation happening again. It will ask for suggestions for its use in a future copy of HotPott.

Action: Clerk to complete the application form. As this will entail removing the equipment, she will ask how many calls have been made in the last twelve months.

POLICE COMMISSIONER'S meeting for town and parish councils - Wednesday 18th May in Alsager. Cllr. Boulton attended

Among the items reported were:

Anybody can dial 999 on a Smart phone to obtain the link to the SWANN App for video contact with the operator if feeling unsafe.

It is not necessary to increase the police presence on streets as over 50% of crime is committed online.

£5,000 extra has been added to the budget to support women and girls.

There are 2345 police officers in Cheshire, the highest number since 1974 and each of the 122 police areas has an officer.

101 call facility is now fit for purpose, the answering time having been reduced from 40 minutes to just 6.

There was a variety of questions from the attendees and because of Cllr. Boulton's frustration regarding the inability to resolve the Council's many Highways issues, he took the opportunity to inform John Dwyer of the Top Up Highways Maintenance scheme.
