6.1. Highways

Updates, completed work or new issues which have arisen since the last meeting will be noted below. Work which hasn't been completed is listed under 'Pending'.

New/Updated/Completed

- The Fingerpost which was at the junction of Street Lane and London Road has disappeared.
Action: The Clerk will contact Daniel Cawthra at Graham Engineering for information.

6.2. Pending

- Culvert outside Pott Hall. No response from Guy Metcalfe regarding delay.
Action: The Clerk will contact him again
- POY1629 Double yellow lines on the Pott Hall and Spuley Lane bends.
- Remedial resurfacing of Shrigley Road from Green Close to the aqueduct.
- Project 1421 (PACP list) Modifications to the 'Chevron Bend'
- Damage to Village Hall roof by articulated lorry. The kerb to be extended for a short distance funded with the ward councillors' allocation in the next financial year. The cones are to remain in situ.

Pott Shrigley website- investigation by Cllrs. Chong and Lancaster. Cllr. Lancaster has contacted a teacher of Media Studies and will show her the Pott Shrigley Directory to see if creating the website would be an appropriate project for a student.

6.6. DEFIBRILLATOR/PHONE BOX – on behalf of the Council, Gareth Winstanley contacted Poynton Town Council and was put in touch with Paul Woodhouse at Hartron, the electrician who installed Poynton’s defibrillators. He will inspect the kiosk and provide an estimate for the work. Gareth has provided him with the instructions for our particular cabinet. The Clerk has acquired the permission from BT for the work to go ahead. Once installed a poster will be bought from Tunnicliffe Signs to indicate the presence of the defibrillator. Gareth has offered to clean the very dirty kiosk and the Clerk has offered to help.
