1. MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

Work on the modifications to the road by the Village Hall will begin during the summer holidays.

3. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING.

3.1. Highways

Updates, completed work or new issues which have arisen since the last meeting will be noted below. Work which hasn't been completed is listed under 'Pending'.

New/Updated/Completed.

● Dominec DeBuchi replied to the Clerk's request for a detailed report on the repairs to Shrigley Road, near the Chevron bend saying *"Last safety inspection 23/04/2024 - 3 defects raised, none of which are on bends. All defects repaired 21/05/2024"*

The accompanying map seems to show an area near Woodbine Cottage but no indication of what the defects were.

● Lesley Anderson, Revenue Recovery Administrator CE Highways replied to the request for a report of the progress in identifying the driver who created the hole in wall at Chevron bend saying, *"I refer to the above incident on Shrigley Road and can confirm that the witness statement provided has been most helpful."*

Cheshire East Highways are now able to progress this claim with the insurance company." Message forwarded to the witness.

● Cllr. Lancaster met Simon Wallace and his apprentice Theo James on 17th May about improvements to bend at Brookbank. These proposals were agreed with Theo, who is to be responsible for the project.

- Two new bend warning signs with slow marking to accompany them
- Edge of carriage way markings to be painted (Centre lines were discussed but we cannot go forward with this due to the width of the road)
- New Chevron signs with a luminous backing board
- Car park signs for the Coppice car park
- A new 'Pott Shrigley' Gateway sign

Cllr Lancaster would like to modify the car park sign to one which alerts people to the presence of other road users and also extend the 30mph speed limit zone to include the bend.

Pending

- Culvert under Shrigley Road outside Pott Hall.
- Remedial resurfacing of Shrigley Road from Green Close to the aqueduct.
- Collapsed wall Bakestonedale Road
- The damaged Adlington/Poynton signpost by church wall.
- Project 1421 (PAHG list) Modifications to the 'Chevron Bend'
- The broken Fence at West Park Gate car park on list for repair.

3.2. INSURANCE

Online quote from Zurich only available up to six months in advance, so deferred until early in 2025.

3.3. CRICKET CLUB

Still no response from the Cricket Club.

3.4. LYCH GATE

The Archdeacon has approved the repairs. Dave Garton's email requesting that, if possible, repairs should take place before August 10th, the date of the next wedding, was forwarded to Ian Greenwood via Alison. The church architect will need to attend to inspect the damage to the Lych gate. Cllr. Greenwood was not in attendance to supply the information.

Action: The Clerk will contact Cllr. Greenwood.

3.5. POTT SHRIGLEY WEBSITE

The Clerk has fulfilled the statutory requirement of the audit and put all the financial documents on the website.

Other councils' risk management policies downloaded for inspection. Template received from Chalc.

Action: The Clerk will produce something similar before presenting it to the Council.

3.6. BUS TIMETABLE MEETING

Follow up meeting 22nd May 2024 Unfortunately Cllr. Lancaster was unable to attend.

3.7. MERSEY FOREST TREE PLANTING SCHEME

Cllr. Chong explained that individual trees are available in this scheme. A grant of up to £885 per tree with a three year contract is available. The Council would buy the tree, pay for its installation and maintenance with the grant and replace it if it dies within the three years. The size suggested is a three metre tree with a girth of 6-8cms.

Action: Cllr. Chong will investigate the price of such a tree.
